## CLUB HISTORY

The Travellers Club was founded in 1819 by a cohort led by Lord Castlereagh and in 1832 moved to its present purpose-built clubhouse designed by Charles Barry. The Club's founding ethos was to establish a meeting place for like-minded gentlemen who had travelled abroad, and where they could also entertain foreign visitors and diplomats posted to London.

Distinguished members of the Diplomatic Service, the Home Civil Service and the Armed Forces have traditionally formed the backbone of the Travellers Club and we continue to have many among our members.

## RULES AND DRESS CODE

- The Travellers Club is a gentlemen Club, ladies are welcome as guests and reciprocal members
- Members and/or guests must be appropriately dressed in the Club House; in particular a gentleman is required to wear in all the public rooms jacket and collar, and a tie (except weekends), and formal long trousers, or the uniform or costume appropriate to his office or vocation or recognised national dress. Ladies should dress with comparable formality. Footwear must be of a similar standard of formality. Casual wear, including denim trousers (or similar trousers) is not acceptable unless for members walking the corridors only on their way from or to the chambers.
- Children are not allowed in the Clubhouse.
- The use of electronic hand devices is not permitted in the public rooms and corridors.
- We require all reciprocal club members to sign the visitor's book on arrival and present your membership card and a letter of introduction.
- Accounts must be settled at with the porter at the front desk upon departure. We accept VISA, MASTERCARD, AMERICAN EXPRESS, cash & cheques.

The Coffee Room restaurant is open Monday to Friday for lunch (from 12.30pm to 2pm) and dinner (from 7pm to 9pm). An option of cold late supper is available for pre/ post theatre and weekends but should be booked with 24 hours' notice.
